We were blessed to be surrounded by another beautiful fall, with crisp nights to watch hometown football games and clear days to see the combines busy in the fields. Growing up here I have always felt it is such a blessing to see how the earth provides for us. The cycle of planting in the fields, and relying on God and having faith that the weather will provide what is needed for those seeds to grow and produce the bounty for harvest.

But what happens when the bounty is not there, when there is not enough to make ends meet? One of the greatest challenges today in communities is hunger, or food insecurity. Food insecurity is defined as when people don't have enough to eat and don't know where their next meal will come from. In South Dakota, 115,000 people, or 12.4% of the population are food insecure and rising, the highest rate in more than a decade. In the United States, neighbors experiencing food insecurity tell us that the high cost of food and other essentials is one of the top reasons why it's increasingly difficult to afford and access the food they need to live. The cost of essentials like food, housing, health care, utilities and child and dependent care can stretch already tight budgets, making it harder to get by.

Research tells us that children that are hungry have a harder time concentrating in school which leads to disruptions in learning that can continue throughout their lifetime. When anyone cannot access nutritious food their health suffers, and conditions like diabetes, heart failure, hypertension, and chronic kidney disease are more likely to develop. Food insecurity is a health issue, a moral issue, a community issue, and a ministry issue.

At Love INC requests for food is one of the most common requests for assistance that we receive from neighbors in need. We meet this need in a variety of ways in collaboration with our Partner Churches and agencies. When we receive the initial request for food assistance, we complete the intake to see what other resources we may be able to assist them with. We may be able to help them qualify for other resources that will offset other money that they can use to help them purchase food. We then help them utilize the food pantries in Lennox or Parker, and give them resources for the food give-a-ways if that is appropriate too. We also have two Partner Churches that offer Gap Ministries of cleaning and hygiene products, which we can also offer them to offset more money to help them purchase food items. If there is an emergency need for food, we have yet another Partner Church that provides gift cards to Sunshine to meet those emergency needs. Love INC and our Partner Churches are able to bless our neighbors in need fighting hunger and hopelessness in our local communities through support and Christ's love.

# The Added Burdens of Winter Weather

Winter weather is right around the corner as we all know, and with the start of cooler temperatures comes added burdens that some of us may not realize. At Love In the Name of Christ of greater Lennox and Turner County, we have already received calls for assistance with one household with no working heat: calls that we receive every year. If you are fortunate enough to have a working furnace, paying your heat bill can be a burden as well. If you are homeless winter adds many layers of challenges and fear.

But that is not the only burden. There are winter coats, hats, boots, and gloves to buy, especially if you have children. They often outgrow their coats almost ever year requiring the purchase of a new one. Inadequate winter clothing can lead to illness, skin problems, even frostbite. If you are someone that has been getting by with sub-standard tires on a car to get back and forth to work, it could be a challenge on snow-packed roads. This could lead to the expense of replacing your tires, or worse, having a tow bill when you end up in the ditch if you don't.

There is also the illness that is present each winter. Whether you become ill or your children, it can easily lead to time missed from work. Many work at jobs with no benefits, meaning time missed from work means no pay. No benefits also means no health insurance.

Still others choose to take no insurance because of the cost, so any trips to the doctor will be self-pay if you have no coverage - and it all adds up.

These are just a handful of the challenges that winter thrusts upon those that are already struggling to manage in their day to day lives. Though Education, Advocacy, Mentoring, and Sharing God's plan for them we hope to transform lives by offering them the peace that God has to offer.

## ANSWERING HIS CALL....

Love INC did feel a call to answer a need for food insecurity, as we were receiving more and more calls for food assistance even before the SNAP food program was put on hold. The Lennox Food Pantry at the Ebenezer Presbyterian Church in Lennox was also feeling the effects with shelves that were in very low supply.

Working together with the Lennox Food Pantry, Love INC let area churches know of the shortage which increased donations. Love INC is also working with our GAP Ministries at Partner Churches to supply non-food supplies for the food pantry.

A Food Give-Away was held in conjunction with Faith Presbyterian Church, Kitchen Kindness and Love INC on November 16, where over 50 individuals/families were able to come and receive food supplies. Additionally, an anonymous donor made it possible for Love INC to be able to donate a Holiday Meal basket, containing either a ham or turkey and all the additional dinner foods to be donated to each of our Partner Churches. Each Partner Church is then able to gift a family of their choice with the Holiday Meal basket for Thanksgiving.

By working together, in our communities with our Partner Churches and with our volunteers, we continue to answer the call of Christ.
